

## VOTING INFORMATION

- Election Day is Tuesday, November 3, 2020
- Registration Deadline
  - **Missouri** - Missouri offers [ONLINE VOTER REGISTRATION](#). Please click the link if you do prefer. You can register by mail to vote in Missouri by printing a voter registration form, filling it out, and mailing it to your local election office. You can also register to vote in person if you prefer.
    - The deadline to register online to vote is Wednesday, October 7, 2020.
    - The deadline for registering by mail to vote is (postmarked by) Wednesday, October 7, 2020.
    - The deadline to register in person to vote is Wednesday, October 7, 2020.
    - The deadline to request a ballot by mail is (received by) 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 21, 2020.
  - **Kansas** - Kansas offers [ONLINE VOTER REGISTRATION](#). Please click the link if you do prefer. You can register by mail to vote in Kansas by printing a voter registration form, filling it out, and mailing it to your local election office. You can also register to vote in person if you prefer.
    - The deadline to register online to vote is Tuesday, October 13, 2020.
    - The deadline for registering by mail to vote is (postmarked by) Tuesday, October 13, 2020.
    - The deadline to register in person to vote is Tuesday, October 13, 2020.
    - The deadline to request a ballot by mail is (received by) Tuesday, October 27, 2020.
    - The early voting period runs from Wednesday, October 14, 2020 to Monday, November 2, 2020 at 12 p.m., but dates and hours may vary based on where you live.
  
- How to vote
  - **Missouri**
    - VOTE IN PERSON
      - **No early voting**  
Missouri does not offer an early voting period. If you will be unable to vote in person on Election Day, you can

request an absentee ballot/mail-in ballot by mail or by visiting your local election office. Mailed requests for absentee ballots must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 21, 2020 for the general election. Voters can vote by absentee in the office of the local election authority until 5:00 p.m. on Monday, November 2, 2020.

- **What to bring**

You will be asked to show ID to vote in Missouri. Acceptable forms of government-issued photo ID include: a driver's license; non-driver's license; US passport; or military ID. If you do not have a government-issued photo ID, you can also show one of the following forms of ID: a voter registration card; ID from a Missouri university, college, vocational or technical school; a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check or other government document that contains your name and address.

Voters without ID: If you are unable to provide ID, you will be able to cast a provisional ballot. Your ballot will count if your signature matches the signature in the voter registry or if you return to your polling place and show a photo ID.

- **VOTE BY MAIL**

- Review the absentee/mail-in ballot application and confirm that you meet the eligibility requirements for voting absentee. Your application may require a notary.
- Fill out the application completely.
- Submit the request to your local election office. You should request your ballot as far in advance of the election as possible. The deadline to request a ballot by mail is (received by) 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 21, 2020.
- When your ballot arrives, read it carefully and follow the instructions to complete it and return it.

- **Kansas**

- **VOTE IN PERSON**

- **Vote early**

Kansas voters can also vote before Election Day. The early voting period runs from Wednesday, October 14, 2020 to Monday, November 2, 2020 at 12 p.m., but dates and hours may vary based on where you live.

- **What to bring**

You will need to show photo ID to vote in Kansas. Acceptable forms include: a driver's license or non-driver's ID card issued by Kansas or by another state; a concealed carry handgun license; US passport; government employee badge or ID; military ID; student ID from an accredited postsecondary institution of education in Kansas; government-issued public assistance ID; or Indian tribal ID. Persons age 65 or older may use expired photo ID documents.

Voters without ID: If you are unable to provide ID, you will be able to vote a provisional ballot and provide your ID to the county prior to the county canvass (7-10 days after the election) in order for it to be counted.

- **VOTE BY MAIL**
  - Request your mail-in ballot with a mail ballot application.
  - Fill out the application completely.
  - Submit the request to your local election office. You should request your ballot as far in advance of the election as possible. The deadline to request a ballot by mail is (received by) Tuesday, October 27, 2020.
  - When your ballot arrives, read it carefully and follow the instructions to complete it and return it.
