

ST. JAMES CHRISTMAS GIVING TREE AND ANAPRA HEATING OIL

Our annual giving tree will be happening this year! We will be partnering again with Bishop Sullivan Center to provide gifts for children in need in the KCMO area this Christmas. We have 26 children this year, boys and girls, who are in need of someone to buy gifts for them. The Giving Tree will be set up in-person at church on Sunday, Nov 28th through Dec 12th, full of ornaments, each with a child's age, gender, size, and a few gift requests. Gift drop-off will be after Masses or by appointment to ensure all gifts are collected.

We are making a hard deadline of December 12th this year in time for Bishop Sullivan Center to distribute to the families for their Christmases.

For those who are hesitant to be with us in-person, gift drop off can be via non-contact appointments. Appointments will be on Sundays, Nov 28th, Dec 5th and Dec 12th.

We will also be making gifts of heating oil to Anapra, Mexico via our partnership with Manos Amigas over the holiday season. Anapra is an exurban community in the area of Juarez. Winter there can be challenging, as many residents live in poverty and have a hard time getting oil to heat their homes during the colder months. Suggested donations are \$50, but any amount is appreciated.

Office of Child and Youth Protection

Americans revolted against a royal government but are fascinated by the royal qualities of power, privilege, position, and possessions. These qualities, though seemingly in conflict with the values of Christian life, are the very gifts which Jesus longs to give us if we allow him to be our king.

He gives us power – the power of the Holy Spirit in the sacraments. He gives us privilege – the privilege to be called the Body of Christ, His church. He gives us position - the position that comes with the promise of a permanent place in his kingdom. He grants us the gift of possessions - a relationship with him through which we discover what truly is worth possessing.

The aforementioned qualities give us the confidence to proclaim that the kingdom of God has already come in Jesus Christ. We are asked to be a model, a sign to the world, of the reality of the kingdom of God so that people inside and outside our community might know that God is in our midst.

In response to a Diocesan Area Planning for Deaneries 1, 2 and 11, 60+ parishioners of St. James who all share in the kingship of Jesus came together last Sunday to help shape the future of St. James Church in Midtown KC. The group's consensus is that the community of St. James is a VIBRANT parish, tasked "to build the Reign of God for all people, serving especially our neighbors in Midtown, Kansas City." Rather than using the scoring options given in the preference survey form, the attendees used a consensus process in our small groups and summary report. The Area Planning Committee representatives of St. James together with other representatives from parishes in the deanery have recommended that this process be integrated with the longer listening process of the Synod on Synodality, a two-year process formally opened by Pope Francis.


