



## *Reflection from Deacon Ross Beaudoin*

HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY to all mothers, grandmothers, adoptive mothers, step-mothers, foster mothers and all who are in the role of MOTHER.

That's a long list, and it reminds us that mother is a title that has a lot of applications. I am happy that I can share a bit today, as I myself have experienced a birth mother, and then after her early death (when I was 4 years old), a grandmother who raised me.
