Office of Child and Youth Protection

2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and
3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected *sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult* to the **Independent Ombudsman, Joe Crayon**, at 816-812-2500, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee, or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.

Reflection from Ben Babaran

Today's Gospel describes Jesus' kingship amidst the sneers and mockery of the Jews as "remembering." The unlikely king, Jesus, is recognized by an unlikely individual, the "other criminal." The criminal said, "Jesus, *remember* me when you come into your kingdom." Jesus replied, "Amen, I say to you, today you will *be with me* in Paradise."

This was a very profound and powerful prayer from the criminal! In the last moments of his life, he recognized Jesus as a King! The man known as a thief saw Jesus' kingdom with the eyes of his heart and wanted to be part of it. He stole heaven in his last breath! He didn't ask for much... He simply asked to be remembered. It was an act of belonging. While Jesus' response: "Amen, I say to you, today you will *be with me* in Paradise" speaks of inclusion.

I look at the cross as the sign of unconditional, sacrificial love, forgiveness and unity. Jesus, our King, hangs from a wooden cross, wears a crown of thorns and his body shows the marks of his torture and of the passion. This is the King we follow... and this King invites us with open arms to embrace him and in embracing him, to embrace all creation with our minds and our hearts.

In our St. James mission statement, we commit as a community to building the reign of God for all people. Our today's solemnity is asking us to revisit this commitment. May we say to the criminal, the alienated, the disenfranchised, homeless and the marginalized: "Today, I am with you and you are with me!"

Let us ask the Lord to remember us as we remember Him until he comes again.
