Joy is rooted in faith and trust, bringing inner Peace through our belief in the promise of the Christ Child.

On this Joyous Sunday, as the Holy night draws near, we are called by God to put aside our daily concerns and stress. With His comfort, we light the third candle of Advent, also called the Shepherd's Candle. It serves to remind us of the Joy brought to Shepherds by the Angels, announcing the birth of Jesus. "Glory to God in the Highest, and Peace to all people on Earth." All people, you and me. God wants us to celebrate Joy in our hearts with faith that He will bring us to a better tomorrow. Rejoice!

- After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Independent Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816-812-2500, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee, or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.
