

The three Scripture readings assigned for this Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time speak about being attentive and listening to the prophet whom God will send.

In St. Mark's Gospel, Jesus entered the synagogue and he taught and everybody is saying, "I wonder what he said." But, Mark won't tell us. Mark is not telling us what he said for some strange reason, but later on we begin to understand.

You see the Kingdom of God is not a book. It is not a series of lectures. It is not a place. The Kingdom of God is a person! And what do people do when they communicate the great truths of God? They teach it. And they live it!

So in Mark, right from the very beginning, he's telling us not so much what Jesus says. Mark asks us to watch what he does. Then, we will understand that the Kingdom of God is among us.
