

The UN lists 10 specific areas:


- 1) equal pay
- 2) civil rights
- 3) affordable housing
- 4) healthcare access
- 5) criminal justice reform
- 6) LGBTQ+ rights
- 7) environmental justice
- 8) education equity
- 9) worker rights
- 10) immigrant rights

Some of the most pressing social justice issues impacting us locally are: poverty, homelessness, climate change, proliferation of nuclear weapons, mass incarceration (especially poor persons of color), immigration, gender inequality, access to health care, education, nutrition.

Office of Child and Youth Protection

The Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph is committed to combating sexual abuse in the Church. If you are a victim of sexual abuse, or if you *observe or suspect* sexual abuse:

- 1. Call the Missouri Child Abuse Hotline at 1-800-392-3738 (if the victim is currently under the age of 18), and
- 2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and
- 3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Independent Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816-812-2500, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee, or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.
