Reflection from Ben Babaran

The Gospel for this Sunday is the only miracle that is included in all the four canonical gospels: Matthew 14:13-21; Mark 6:31-44; Luke 9:12-17; John 6:1-14. It is that important to the Christian life and mission.

There are many important lessons we can learn from the miracle on the mountain. I would like to share three of them:

The miracle was a banquet of love. Jesus said, "Have the people recline." The point is what my parents have inculcated in me growing up – the Filipino hospitality. When anybody comes to you, you sit them down, and make them feel at home, and you share with them what you have. It is in the sharing that the guest or visitor will realize that the world is full of love. The miracle made strangers, unknown to each other, share in the banquet of love.

The generosity of the boy became the motivation of a great miracle for his community. From two fish and five loaves, the community was blessed with twelve more baskets of food. God works with what we have. May this remind us that a dollar given out of love is as priceless as a million dollars.

Moved with compassion, Jesus replicated the miracle of Elisha in the first reading. He was sensitive to their needs and situation. Christ cares for our needs both physically and spiritually.

We are Eucharistic people, called to love, to be generous and to be compassionate. As Cardinal Pierre said during the National Eucharistic Congress, "When we are truly 'revived' by the Eucharist, then our encounter with Christ's real presence in the Sacrament opens us to an encounter with Him in the rest of life" — especially in the poor and marginalized. May Christ work miracles in us and through us.

- 2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and
- 3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected *sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult* to the **Independent Ombudsman, Joe Crayon,** at 816-812-2500, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee, or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.
