The Gospel Mark 9:30-37 shows Jesus' focus on preparing his disciples for the events that were to unfold; His death and then resurrection. He foretells his death and resurrection which confuses His disciples but they are afraid of questioning. This confusion reminds us that faith sometimes involves grappling with uncertainty yet Jesus invites us to trust his plan, and I like to remind myself of that on my journey of faith. Also in this Gospel, Jesus calls upon the mission of Christian service when He says "Whoever welcomes one of my children in my name welcomes me." This reminds us that love should guide our interactions with others. This Gospel in my opinion is a well-rounded way to remind us that our faith and love for others should guide us in our lives just as Jesus taught. - **Oliver Goss**

- 3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Independent Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816-812-2500, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee, or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.
