Reflection from Ben Babaran

With the national election drawing near, people are drawing lines – lines that exclude. There seems to be so much division and conflict in our world, our church, our country, our communities, our families, and if we are honest, even within ourselves. The gospel of competition is being preached. This Sunday's readings, however, give us pointers on how to address these conflicts and work toward reconciliation, resolution and harmony.

"Would that all the people of the LORD were prophets! Would that the LORD might bestow his spirit on them all!" This was Moses' response to Joshua, son of Nun, who asked Moses to stop Eldad and Medad in prophesying because they were not among those to whom the spirit was bestowed. The Spirit blows where it will. No human is able to have monopoly of the Spirit. No "side" can claim that they have the Spirit and the other does not. In the same manner, Jesus tells John in the Gospel, "Whoever is not against us, is for us!"

So, to resolve conflicts, one must first acknowledge that others, even those we disagree with, also have the Spirit of God with and in them. All have been given of the same Spirit, but not all have received the same Gifts. St. James Kansas City celebrates this variety of Gifts in our diversity. May we use these various gifts harmoniously to reach our same goal – our God!

Pope Francis during his trip to Asia acknowledged the diverse religions in the area. He said, "All religions are a path to arrive at God. They are like different languages to arrive there. But God is God for all."

We may not agree on everything and see things the same way. Each of us has specific gifts and thus, different approaches. But we can be of One Mind and One Heart on our way to One God!

I had the privilege of listening to Rev. Darryl Burton and his story last Wednesday during the Troost Alliance meeting. He challenged us to love and pray for those who hurt us. This challenge reminded me of the Eucharistic Prayer II for Reconciliation which I had the honor of praying in the past.

May I share with you this prayer: "For though the human race is divided by dissension and discord, yet we know that by testing us you change our hearts to prepare them for reconciliation. Even more, by your Spirit you move human hearts so that enemies may speak to each other again, adversaries may join hands, and peoples may seek to meet together in peace. By the working of your power, it comes about, O Lord, that hatred is overcome by love, revenge gives way to forgiveness, and discord is changed to mutual respect." May our reception of the Eucharist move us to live in mutual respect!

After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected *sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult* to the **Independent Ombudsman, Joe Crayon,** at 816-812-2500, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee, or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.
