# Reflection from Fr. Garry Richmeier

Our theme for Advent is "We're waiting." My question is, "What's new?" In first grade I remember often waiting for recess. In junior high I remember waiting to get to highschool. In highschool I remember waiting for my moustache to grow (it kinda, sorta did). In college I remember waiting anxiously to see what grades I got on my tests and papers. As an adult I seem to be waiting a lot, from waiting in traffic, to waiting for medical test results, to waiting to hear from loved ones who live elsewhere.

We spend most of our lives waiting, it seems, and we don't really like it much. We'd much rather have whatever it is we are waiting for to show up now, not later. Then there is the uncertainty of whether or not it will arrive at all. And if there is one thing we humans don't like, it's uncertainty.

So what's new about waiting this Advent season? The waiting itself won't be new. It will be the same-old, same-old. But what can be new or different, is how we wait. We can wait with a sense of "Something's wrong with this," or we can wait with an attitude of "This is how it works." The latter attitude will cause us much less anxiety. We can wait with an attitude of fear and dread, or we can choose to approach waiting with curiosity about what will eventually happen. Most of us can do with a little less fear and dread. We can wait with a sense of confidence that we will be able to handle and deal with whatever eventually happens. After all, we are still here because that has been the case in the past. What helps in this regard is consciously keeping track of all the strengths, virtues, and abilities that God has given me to help me navigate this maze called life. And maybe most important of all, we can wait with faith and trust that no matter what happens, God will be there to make it part of the bigger picture. Just like from our mistakes can come greater abilities and skills, so God can bring about good from even apparently awful things.

If we want to change how we wait, it won't happen automatically. Like any other ability, it takes focused, conscious practice. But if we get a little better at it, we might suffer a little less as we wait. And who knows, as our attention shifts a little from the awfulness of waiting, we might catch a better glimpse of God at work, even in the waiting.

#### Office of Child and Youth Protection

- 1. Call the Missouri Child Abuse Hotline at 1-800-392-3738 (if the victim is currently under the age of 18), and
- 2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and
- 3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected *sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult* to the **Independent Ombudsman**, **Joe Crayon**, at 816-812-2500, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee, or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.
