

4. What is the relationship with the diocese if St James Parish becomes parishioner-led?

We will remain a diocesan parish with all the benefits and responsibilities of participating in the diocese. The only "Glitch" is that the diocese has no job category for "Parish Organizer," and we may need to use the term "Parish administrator" when dealing with the diocese.

5. Will sacraments continue to be provided at St James?

6. Who chose the transition team?

Diane Etzel-Wise, Martha Belker, and Bill Cordaro ran our parish Stewardship Appeal in the fall. After the appeal, Fr. Don asked us if we would be open to being the start of the transition team. Since then, Ben and Donna Arnone, our new parish bookkeeper, joined the team.

Child and Youth Protection

The Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph is committed to combating sexual abuse in the Church. If you are a victim of sexual abuse, or if you *observe or suspect sexual abuse:*

- 2. Contact your local law enforcement agency or call 911, and
- 3. After reporting to these civil and law enforcement authorities, report suspected sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult to the Independent Ombudsman, Joe Crayon, at 816-812-2500, if the abuse involves a priest, deacon, employee, or volunteer of the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph.
