



St. James is looking for a Parish Organizer-Leader

St. James is a parish with a rich history of living the Catholic Social Teachings at the corner of 39th and Troost in Kansas City, MO. We have a very active community comprising approximately 200 families spread over 72 zip codes in the metro area. Many of our members are older and have years of experience volunteering or working for the Catholic Church.

St. James is looking for a leader to take us into the next phase of our parish life. This is a bold move since no Catholic Church in our diocese uses this leadership model. We want to make Pope Francis' call to be a "Synodal Church" a reality at St. James.

A qualified person must be Catholic and able to:

- 1. Be passionate about leading the parish from a lay-led parish to a community-led, synodal parish.
- 2. Identify gifts in each parishioner and invite them to use their gifts to fulfill the parish mission.
- 3. Engage all parishioners in the decision-making process on major parish topics.
- 4. Provide training and support to parishioners at all levels of the parish ministry.
- 5. Represent the interest of the parish to the diocese and broader community.

In the past, St. James has had a leader who was a "Parish Administrator." We now seek a "Parish Organizer" to organize our gifts to make a difference in KC and the world. ST. JAMES FEB 16 COMMUNITY-SYNOD MEETING REPORT

Over 50 parishioners were in attendance while a number of children were playing with Linda Art in the Family Room. The focus of the Synod was to discuss and decide if St. James wants to hire a full-time instead of a part-time Parish Organizer. The synod was informed that St. James has enough money in the current budget to hire a part-time person (29 hours a week) but would need more parish income to hire a full-time person.

Here is the information presented at the Synod.

- **-Part-time:** 29 hours a week at \$30 per hour is \$45,240 plus taxes of \$6,560 for a total of \$51,800. No benefits are provided since the work week is less than 30 hours.
- **-Full-time**: 40 hours a week at \$30 per hour, this is a salaried position with a salary of \$62,400. Taxes and benefits will be \$18,250, for a total of \$80,600.
- -The difference between part-time and full-time is \$28,800 per year.
- -We have secured a gift of \$12,000 for one year with the possibility of being renewed if St. James hires a full-time Parish Organizer.
- -St. James will need to increase tithing by \$16,800 or about 10%.

The question was presented after much discussion: "Do you agree or disagree with the following statement? St. James should hire a full-time Parish Organizer to lead us as we grow into a Synodal Parish." The responses were: 50% Strongly Agreed, 26% Agreed, 11% Neutral, 7% Disagreed, 2% Strongly Disagree, and 4% said "I Don't Know".

Some members expressed concern about those in the parish who are already giving all they can afford. To those who are making such a sacrifice, we say you are doing your part. Thank you.

We currently have two promising applicants. We have several parishioners with years of interviewing and hiring experience who have offered to help.

We will continue to keep you posted. Please keep St. James Community, the synodal process, and our search for a Parish Organizer in your prayers


