



PANTRY SUNDAY-MARCH 2

Sunday, March 2 is Pantry Sunday, when we help replenish Bishop Sullivan's Pantry. Bishop Sullivan is a social outreach organization just three doors



south of St. James on Troost. Many of the services they provide were started in St. James' basement. They're requesting jelly, breakfast cereal, or hygiene items such as shampoo, deodorant, and toothpaste. The Pantry is grateful for our continued support.

UPDATE ON CHURCH FROZEN PIPES

The problem of frozen pipes that caused St. James to postpone the Chili Draze until March 1 has been addressed. The work was completed by parishioner Robby Rusca with assistance from Jordan Schiele. Both men are part of the Jerusalem Farm community (JerusalamFarm.org), which is located on Kansas City's northeast side.

Robby sealed a large cold air leak in our old boiler room in the basement which led to the water lines below the south sacristy being freeze-prone for years. He then installed a valve on the exposed water line, allowing us to temporarily solve the problem until we have more time and warmer weather.

We want to thank Robby Rusca for keeping a potential catastrophe at bay. *This is what a community-led parish looks like*.

St. James is a parish with a rich history of living the Catholic Social Teachings at the corner of 39th and Troost in Kansas City, MO. We have a very active community comprising approximately 200 families spread over 72 zip codes in the metro area. Many of our members are older and have years of experience volunteering or working for the Catholic Church.

St. James is looking for a leader to take us into the next phase of our parish life. This is a bold move since no Catholic Church in our diocese uses this leadership model. We want to make Pope Francis' call to be a "Synodal Church" a reality at St. James.

A qualified person must be Catholic and able to:

- 1. Be passionate about leading the parish from a lay-led parish to a community-led, synodal parish.
- 2. Identify gifts in each parishioner and invite them to use their gifts to fulfill the parish mission.
- 3. Engage all parishioners in the decision-making process on major parish topics.
- 4. Provide training and support to parishioners at all levels of the parish ministry.
- 5. Represent the interest of the parish to the diocese and broader community.

SECOND READING — 1 COR 15:54-58


Paul speaks of Jesus's resurrection as taking away the "sting" and "victory" of death. What words of comfort do you use to those grieving over the death of a loved one?
