



ST. JAMES IS LOOKING FOR A FULL-TIME SYNODAL PARISH DIRECTOR

St. James is a parish with a rich history of living the Catholic Social Teachings at the corner of 39th and Troost in Kansas City, MO. We have a very active community comprising approximately 200 families spread over 72 zip codes in the metro area. Our members represent all ages, ethnicities and backgrounds, and many members have years of experience volunteering or working for the Catholic Church.

St. James is looking for a leader to take us into the next phase of our parish life. This is a bold move since no Catholic Church in our diocese uses this leadership model. We want to make Pope Francis' call to be a "Synodal Church" a reality at St. James. He called the way of synodality "what God expects of the church in the third millennium," stressing that "the synodal process should be not an occasional experience, but one of structural change, 'where all can feel at home and participate."

A qualified person must be Catholic and able to:

- 1. Be passionate about leading the parish from a layled parish to a community-led, synodal parish.
- 2. Identify gifts in each parishioner and invite them to use their gifts to fulfill the parish mission.
- 3. Engage all parishioners in the decision-making process on major parish topics.
- 4. Provide training and support to parishioners at all levels of the parish ministry.
- 5. Represent the interest of the parish to the diocese and broader community.

READINGS FOR JUNE 1, 2025 ASCENSION OF THE LORD

FIRST READING — Acts 7:55-60: Stephen, filled with the Holy Spirit, gazed up to behold a radiant vision of Jesus at God's right hand, proclaimed this heavenly revelation, and as an enraged mob—whose cloaks were laid at Saul's feet—stoned him, he prayed for his attackers' forgiveness before peacefully surrendering his spirit.

Reflection Question: How does Stephen's unwavering faith and his act of forgiveness in the face of extreme persecution challenge you to respond with compassion and grace when confronted with hostility or injustice?

SECOND READING — Revelation 22:12-14, 16-17, 20: John hears a divine declaration announcing that Jesus, the eternal Alpha and Omega, will soon return to reward each person according to their deeds and invites all who have cleansed themselves to partake in eternal life—with the tree of life and life-giving water symbolizing that promise—an invitation echoed by the Spirit and the bride.

Reflection Question: In what ways does the promise of eternal life and the call to receive spiritual renewal inspire you to examine and transform your own journey of faith?

GOSPEL— John 17:20-26: Jesus prays that all believers, both now and in the future, may be united in the same intimate and perfected relationship with the Father and the Son, so that God's glory and love may be evident in their lives, affirming that He was sent by the Father.

Reflection Question: How can you cultivate and embody the unity and love that Jesus prays for, so that your relationships and community reflect the divine partnership between the Father and the Son?

They also need a mastermind organizer for their clothing closet at their Truman location and welcoming smiles at both their Troost and Truman Road food pantry locations.
