



Pat Marrin was introduced to the Synod, and the Synod confirmed the Transition Team's choice of Pat as Parish Synodal Director. Pat is planning to start on June 23. Pat will be working part-time (up to 29 hours

a week) with the possibility that, once he gets settled and has a handle on all the work that needs to be done, he could hire an assistant.

The Transition Team has been transferring more of its tasks to the Parish Leadership Team and will continue to support Pat until Pat is fully integrated into the leadership role.

We recently hired Envision to maintain our lawn. They quoted us a very reasonable charge (\$65 per cut) to cut all the grass on our campus, complete with trimming and blowing off our sidewalks.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHT FOR THE DAY

"Then Abram gave him a tenth of everything." Thus, Abraham became the first recorded person to tithe in Scripture. He didn't just give 10% of his income, he gave 10% of EVERYTHING! For some tithing is very difficult, especially when trying to make ends meet. For others, tithing 10% might be less of an obstacle. What about the other 90%? We can have little doubt that Abraham would give up all 100% if God asked him to do so. He was willing to sacrifice his beloved son, Isaac as proof of his faithfulness. What are we—as faithful stewards—doing with our other 90%?

READING FOR SUNDAY, JUNE 29, 2025, SOLEMNITY OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL THE APOSTLES

First Reading - Acts 12:1-11: This passage recounts how, amid King Herod's brutal persecution—marked by the martyrdom of James and the imprisonment of Peter—the Church's fervent prayer led to a miraculous, divinely orchestrated escape for Peter.

Reflection Question: In what ways can you draw strength from prayer during difficult times, and how might divine intervention inspire you to persevere despite life's challenges?

Second Reading - 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 17-18: Paul celebrates the completion of his ministry and his steadfast faith, affirming that his imminent departure will be rewarded with the crown of righteousness, not only for himself but for all who long for the Lord's appearing.

Reflection Question: How can Paul's unwavering trust in God's rescue and promise of eternal reward inspire you to persist through personal challenges in your spiritual journey?

Gospel - Matthew 16:13-19: In Caesarea Philippi, Jesus challenges His disciples' perceptions of His identity, and when Peter boldly declares Him as the Christ, Jesus affirms Peter as the rock of His Church and entrusts him with the keys to the kingdom, symbolizing divine authority that overcomes all earthly opposition.

Reflection Question: How does Peter's confession and the authority entrusted to him inspire you to boldly affirm your own understanding of faith and actively shape your community?

ST. JAMES' VOTIVE CANDLES

Lighting a votive candle at church extends one's prayers and shows support for the person being prayed for. Additionally, people may light candles to express gratitude for answered prayers.



The suggested donation for lighting a votive candle at St. James has been updated to \$5.00, up from \$2.00, to cover the significantly higher costs for the candles. The votive candle enveplopes now reflect the suggested donation increase. Everyone is invited to participate in this form of prayer.

WHY CATHOLICS USE INSENCE?




Catholics use incense as a symbol of prayer rising to heaven, reflecting the sweetness of sacrifice and the presence of the divine during worship. Additionally, its use helps to sanctify the space, engaging the senses in the liturgical experience and deepening the spiritual atmosphere of the celebration.
