





OUR PARISH SYNODAL DIRECTOR HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED!!!!!!!



The Transition Team is pleased to announce that our recommendation for the Synodal Parish Director is Pat Marrin. Pat has been a member of St. James for over 24 years and is very familiar with what a Synodal Parish should look like. Besides being a member of the Transition Team, he has taught

theology at all levels of education and has extensive pastoral experience.

After affirming our decision during a meeting with the diocesan HR representative, Pat is finishing up some onboarding requirements and plans to begin serving us on a part-time basis (average 29 hours a week or less) in mid-June. We are conducting discussions about hiring another part-time person to assist Pat in his duties.

We plan to have Pat speak at the Synod Meeting on June 15, outlining his vision for St. James and the role of parishioners in that vision. At the conclusion of his presentation to the community, we will have a discernment and confirmation by the synod.

The Transition Team wants to thank St. James for your prayers, patience and support through this process. We are excited about our next steps in the process of becoming a more synodal parish. Please continue to pray for our parish.

Sunday, June 8, following our Mass, Trinidad Raj Molina will share how he and others provide immigrants with rapid response assistance, immigrants who are new arrivals to the KC area. Trinidad is from AIRR, Advocates for Immigrant Rights and Reconciliation. Come and hear what we can do to help our neighbors.

June 8, we will have a session for all those preparing for First Communion on June 22. We will be learning about Reconciliation and the Eucharist. Banner making in Marian Hall after Mass. June 15, we will be celebrating First Reconciliation in Marian Hall, followed by a session on Eucharist and practice receiving Communion. We will finish the banners if needed.

June 22: First Communion Sunday - It is very important that our candidates for First Reconciliation and First Communion attend Mass on June 22 and the sessions on June 8 and 15 after Mass.

READING FOR THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY, JUNE 15, 2025

First Reading - Proverbs 8:22-31: In this passage, Divine Wisdom is personified as a timeless companion and craftsman who was present at the very beginning of God's creative work, intricately shaping the cosmos and delighting in the unfolding of life.

Reflection Question: How does embracing the image of Wisdom as an ever-present, creative partner with God influence your perspective on the inherent order and beauty in the world around you?

Second Reading - Romans 5:1-5: Paul explains that being justified by faith in Jesus grants us peace with God, access to His overflowing grace, and a transformative hope that is refined through enduring life's afflictions.

Reflection Question: How might you view your own challenges as opportunities for character development and deeper experience of God's love working within you?

Gospel - John 16:12-15: Jesus promises that even though He cannot yet disclose everything, the Holy Spirit—the Spirit of Truth—will soon guide His disciples into all truth by revealing what is to come and glorifying Him.

Reflection Question: In what ways might you open your heart to the guidance of the Holy Spirit, allowing it to reveal deeper truths and enrich your understanding of God's plan?
