

READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, AUGUST 3, 2025, THE EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME



First Reading - Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23: Life and all human endeavors are ultimately meaningless or futile without God.

Reflection Question: What do you chase after in life? How could including God in your plans and efforts make them more worthwhile?

Second Reading - **Colossians 3:1-5**, **9-11:** Christians should live with a heavenly focus, putting to death sinful earthly desires as part of their new life in Christ.

Reflection Question: Are there things you could give to God this week? What heavenly focuses do you find yourself thinking about week to week?

Gospel -Luke 12:13-21: The Parable of the Rich Fool- Storing up earthly riches without being "rich toward God" is foolish. Life is short and material possessions cannot save or satisfy in the end.

Reflection Question: Do you feel rich in God? If so, how could you encourage others? If not, what could you change about daily life that would let you to see the richness of Christ more?

Summary of Synod Meeting Discussion

On July 20^{th,} about 60–70 parishioners explored how we should respond if ICE raids a Sunday service. Participants agreed to broaden the dialogue via online forums and the parish bulletin. We suggested forming a committee to draft policy which the Leadership Team can review and parish can approve.

- quotas of 7,000 daily apprehensions.
- Churches are probable targets for unannounced, masked ICE operations.
- Media reports document indiscriminate arrests, dueprocess violations, profiling, and policy changes stripping protections from long-term immigrants and asylum seekers.

Parish Response and Solidarity

• Consensus that the Gospel calls for welcoming immigrants, resisting unjust deportations, and standing in solidarity with "illegal" long-term residents.

- Parish affirmation taped to church doors; coordination with St. Therese Little Flower and St. Francis Xavier parishes.
- Plans to engage diocesan leadership and the broader Kansas City Catholic community.

Key Elements of a Response Plan

- Legal clarity: ICE must present a judicial warrant naming sought individuals; sanctuary claims have limited protection.
- Define public versus private areas within the church.
- During any ICE visit, the assembly's prayer and song serve as a unified backdrop for collective action.
- Trained spokespersons stationed at each entrance to:
 - Request and verify agent identification and authorization
 - Photograph agents and record vehicle/license information
 - Alert media and neighboring parishes
 - Maintain nonviolent, civil engagement without physical resistance
