READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, AUGUST 31, 2025, THE TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME



First Reading -Sirach 3:17-18, 20, 28-29: God will gather a global, multi-ethnic people to Himself, bring His scattered people home, and include even outsiders in His priestly service. Reflection Question: How have I experienced healing, strength, or renewal through humility and openness to God?

Second Reading - Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24a: Believers no longer approach God in fear through the old covenant, but in joy and confidence through Christ, who brings reconciliation and life. Reflection Question: How do I sometimes approach God more like the Israelites at Mount Sinai —with fear, distance, or hesitation—rather than with the joy of Mount Zion?

Gospel -Luke 14:1, 7-14: True humility and generosity seeks no self-advantage but reflects God's kingdom values.

Reflection Question: When have I been tempted to seek recognition, status, or the "best seat" in life? What does choosing the lowest place look like in my daily relationships and work?
