

READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 7, 2025, THE TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME



First Reading -Wisdom 9:13-18b: Humans cannot know God's ways by themselves; only divine wisdom and the Spirit reveal the right path.

Reflection Question: In what areas of my life am I relying too heavily on my own understanding, and how can I invite God's wisdom and Spirit to guide me instead?

Second Reading - **Philemon 9-10, 12-17**: Paul pleads with Philemon to receive Onesimus not as a slave, but as a brother in Christ, equal in love.

Reflection Question: How do I view and treat others in my life — especially those I may see as 'less than' me? What would it mean to welcome them as a true brother or sister in Christ?

Gospel -Luke 14:25-33: Discipleship means total commitment to Jesus, even above family, comfort, or possessions, and requires "counting the cost."

Reflection Question: "What attachments or comforts in my life make it hard for me to follow Jesus wholeheartedly, and how might I begin to 'count the cost' of true discipleship?"
