

READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 28, 2025, TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIMES



First Reading -Amos 6:1a, 4-7: Amos condemns Israel's wealthy leaders for their careless luxury and disregard for their nation's downfall, warning that they will be the first taken into exile and their revelry will end.

Reflection Question: Am I ever tempted to live in comfort and self-indulgence while ignoring the struggles, injustice, or suffering around me? How is God calling me to respond differently?

Second Reading - 1 Timothy 6:11-16: Paul urges Timothy to flee from greed and sin, and instead pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, and gentleness.

Reflection Question: What would it look like in my daily life to "fight the good fight of faith" by pursuing righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, and gentleness?

Gospel -Luke 16:19-31: Jesus tells a parable about a rich man who lived in luxury and a poor beggar named Lazarus who suffered outside his gate. When they both died, Lazarus was comforted in heaven, while the rich man was tormented in Hell.

Reflection Question: In what ways might I be overlooking the needs of others around me, and how can I respond now, while I still have the chance?


