READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, OCTOBER 5, 2025, TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIMES



First Reading -Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4: Habakkuk wrestles with God's silence in the face of injustice. God answers that justice will come in His timing. The proud will fall. The faithful will endure.

Reflection Question: When God's justice feels delayed, how can I choose to live by faith and trust His timing instead of becoming discouraged?

Second Reading - 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14: Paul exhorts Timothy to be bold, unashamed, and faithful—using God's Spirit to endure hardship and to guard the truth of the gospel.

Reflection Question: What gifts or responsibilities has God entrusted to me, and how am I guarding and using them with courage, love, and faithfulness?

Gospel -Luke 17:5-10: Even a little faith has great power, and true discipleship means humble obedience without seeking recognition.

Reflection Question: How can I practice humble obedience in my daily life, trusting that even small acts of faith can have a powerful impact?

9/21 Synodal Meeting Summary

Last Sunday the parish was invited to stay after Mass for our Synodal Meeting. The main topic of our meeting this month was St. James' Colonnade, security, and hospitality to our unhoused community.

A security survey was sent out earlier that week to get a feel for how safe parishioners felt. The results of this survey are attached in the Friday Email.

After viewing the results of the survey, Diane Etzel-Wise interviewed Katrina Renee from the community of people using the colonnade. She spoke about how Pat had made her feel welcome and how having the collonade as shelter was a much safer option for her than many other places. She also highlighted bathroom use as a main issue for the houseless population.

The parishioners spent the last part of the meeting discussing the main issues, voicing concerns, and considering ideas.

The main concerns raised were related to safety, sanitation, liability, children, and drug use.

The main humanitarian goals...

discussed were restroom needs, ministry opportunities, and the church's responsibility to serve the community around us.

It was decided that there will be a larger discussion including the thoughts of the houseless peoples and experts in this field.

The Leadership Team will create short term goals and begin steps to address immediate issues.

A Task Force will be formed specifically for Colonnade Ministry to help research, address long term goals, and implement community-led solutions.
