READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 14, 2025, FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS



First Reading -Numbers 21:4b-9: When the Israelites sinned and faced deadly consequences, God provided a way of healing and life through looking at the bronze serpent in faith.

Reflection Question: When I face the consequences of my own failures, do I turn in faith to God's provision for healing and life, or do I keep looking for solutions elsewhere?

Second Reading - **Philippians 2:6-11**: Jesus humbled Himself in obedience, even to death, and God exalted Him as Lord over all.

Reflection Question: In what areas of my life is God inviting me to practice humility and obedience, trusting that true exaltation comes from God alone?

Gospel -**John 3:13-17**: God sent Jesus from heaven to be lifted up on the cross so that, out of love, all who believe can have salvation not condemnation.

Reflection Question: How does God's offer of love instead of condemnation effect your heart? Does it change how you view the world or how you treat others?
