READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 2, 2025, THE COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED



First Reading -Wisdom 3:1-9: The souls of the righteous are in God's care and, despite suffering in life, they will be rewarded with peace, immortality, and honor because they trusted in Him. Reflection Question: How does the promise of eternal peace for the faithful influence the way you face trials and challenges in your life today?

Second Reading - **Romans 5:5-11**: God proved His love by sending Christ to die for us while we were still sinners, reconciling us to Himself and giving us hope and salvation through Jesus. **Reflection Question:** How does knowing that Christ died for you even while you were still a sinner affect the way you view God's grace and your relationship with Him today?

Gospel -John 6:37-40: Jesus will never reject anyone who comes to Him in faith, and it is God's will that all who believe receive eternal life and be raised up on the last day.

Reflection Question: What does Jesus' promise to "never cast out" those who come to Him mean for your understanding of God's love and security in your faith?

October Synod Meeting Summary

Thirty people attended this month. The main topic "honoring ministry and securing safety at St James." Bill Cordaro presented a proposal to

- explore further engagement based on a draft plan,
- secure the colonnade with gates and fencing which would be open for parish activities and day time parish outreach,
- recruit more volunteers and collaborate with existing housing, mental health, and support services through the work of the Task Force members.

Toward the end, the group was asked: "Is there anyone who cannot accept St. James securing the colonnade by installing fencing and gates?" By this time, attendance had dropped to about 20 people. Four individuals said they could not accept the fencing idea. A follow-up meeting was held October 24th to determine the next steps to be taken toward these three actions.

Updates will be shared in subsequent emails and announcements at church.
