

# READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 16, 2025, THE THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIMES



First Reading -Malachi 3:19-20a: God promises a day when the wicked will be destroyed, but the faithful will experience healing and joy through God's righteousness.

**Reflection Question:** How does the promise of both judgment and healing challenge you to examine the way you live in light of God's justice and mercy?

**Second Reading** - **2 Thessalonians 3:7-12**: Paul urges believers to follow his example of diligence, warning against laziness and encouraging everyone to work responsibly and contribute to the community.

**Reflection Question:** How does this call to work diligently and not be idle challenge your attitude toward responsibility and service in your daily life?

Gospel -Luke 21:5-19: Jesus foretells times of turmoil and persecution but calls His followers to remain steadfast in faith, trusting in God's guidance and promise of ultimate deliverance.

Reflection Question: When faced with uncertainty, opposition, or fear, how can Jesus' call to perseverance and trust strengthen your faith and shape the way you respond to challenges?


