READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, DECEMBER 21, 2025,

THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT



First Reading - Isaiah 7:10-14 God gives King Ahaz a sign—a promised child called Immanuel, meaning "God with us," to assure the people of God's presence and faithfulness.

Reflection Question: What does the promise of "God with us" mean for you in moments of fear or uncertainty?

Second Reading - **Romans 1:1-7** Paul introduces himself as a servant of Jesus, called to share the gospel promised through the Scriptures, and affirms that believers are called to belong to Christ and live as holy people.

Reflection Question: How does knowing you are "called to belong to Jesus Christ" shape the way you approach your daily life?

Gospel - **Matthew 1:18-24** An angel tells Joseph not to fear taking Mary as his wife because her child is from the Holy Spirit, fulfilling the prophecy of Immanuel.

Reflection Question: Where might God be inviting you to trust Him and obey, even when His plans don't match your expectations?
