

We did it! Thanks to your incredible generosity, the roof has been repaired, and our church is safe and dry. Because of you, St. James can continue to be a synodal parish where we worship, grow, and serve the community together.

As a result of your incredible generosity—and a \$5,000 matching gift—our parish raised over \$17,000 to repair the church roof! The total cost of the roof work was about \$11,000, which means we now have an additional \$6,000 to restore the south interior wall that was damaged by water from the compromised roof.

READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY, DECEMBER 14, 2025,

THE THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT



First Reading - Isaiah 35:1–6a, 10 Promises that God will transform the barren places with joy, healing, and restoration as His redeemed people return home in everlasting gladness.

Reflection Question: In what areas of your life do you long for God's renewing joy and healing, and how might you open yourself to that restoration?

Second Reading - James 5:7–10 urges believers to be patient and steadfast as they await the Lord's coming, looking to the prophets as examples of endurance amid suffering.

Reflection Question: In what situations in your life do you find it hardest to practice patient endurance, and how might remembering God's timing change your response?

Gospel - Matthew 11:2–11 shows John the Baptist seeking confirmation about Jesus' identity, and Jesus affirming both His messianic works and John's unique role in preparing the way. Reflection Question: When you experience doubt or uncertainty in your faith, how does John's example encourage you to bring your questions to Jesus and look for His work in your life?
