

READINGS FOR SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 15, 2026, THE SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIMES



First Reading - Sirach 15:15-20 God gives humans genuine freedom to choose between life and death, good and evil, and God holds us responsible for the choices we make.

Reflection Question: How does knowing that God sets life and death, good and evil, before you shape the way you make daily decisions?

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 2:6-10 God's true wisdom is hidden from worldly understanding and is made known only through the Spirit to those who love Him.

Reflection Question: In what ways might you be relying on human wisdom instead of remaining open to what God's Spirit wants to reveal to you?

Gospel - Matthew 5:17-37 Jesus fulfills the Law by calling his followers beyond outward obedience to a deeper righteousness that transforms the heart, intentions, and relationships.

Reflection Question: Where might Jesus be inviting you to move from simply "following rules" to allowing your inner attitudes and actions to be reshaped by love and integrity?

First Communion April 12th

Sessions will be in Marian Hall for those who will receive the Eucharist for the first time:

- March 1st - learning about the Sacrament of Reconciliation
- March 8th - First Reconciliation Service after Mass, followed by a session on the Eucharist
- March 15th - First Communion session
- March 22nd - First Communion practice and making banners for First Communion Sunday. Parents needed to help children.
- April 12th - First Communion Sunday

Confirmation Info

Confirmation will be at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception on Saturday, March 7th. St. James has one candidate for Confirmation : Ben Bautista. Ben is a sophomore at Rockhurst High School. You may have seen him assisting with the collection during Mass.

The next Confirmation session is Feb. 8th, followed by the Feb. 22nd session.

Tri-Parish News

Since St. James, St. Therese Little Flower, and St. Francis Xavier share a pastor, Fr. Don Farnan, he and some of the parish leaders have been meeting and looking for ways to have the three parishes share experiences and resources.

One of the ways that this is going to be done is to share more information about events at each parish and for all of us to share the liturgies of the Triduum during Holy Week (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil).

An opportunity to participate in Holy Week is through the Liturgical Dance group at St. Therese Little Flower. This group will assist in the Washing of the Feet ritual on Holy Thursday, the Unveiling of the Cross on Good Friday, and in some way on Holy Saturday.
